#### TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2022

#### Structure, governance and management

The District is a constituent part of The Scout Association (incorporated by Royal Charter, which in turn gives authority to both the Bye Laws and Policy Organisation and Rules (POR) of The Scout Association). In addition, the District is a charity registered separately with the Charity Commission. The charity is managed by its Trustees (the District Executive Committee). Trustees are appointed in accordance with the Governing Document (POR), and fall into one of three groupings:

- •Ex officio (by virtue of their appointment).
- •Nominated by the District Commissioner and approved by the District Scout Council.
- •Elected by the District Scout Council.

In addition the District Executive has power to co-opt additional Trustees. All Trustees, on appointment, receive a face-to-face briefing. They are responsible for complying with charity legislation. This includes registration, keeping proper accounts and making returns to the Charity Commission as appropriate. The District Executive Committee exists to support the District Commissioner in meeting the responsibilities of her appointment.

#### Objectives and activities

The objectives of the District are as a unit of The Scout Association.

The aim of The Scout Association is to promote the development of young people in achieving their full physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potentials, as individuals, as responsible citizens and as members of their local, national and international communities.

The method of achieving the Aim of The Association is by providing an enjoyable and attractive scheme of progressive training, based on the Scout Promise and Law and guided by adult leadership.

#### Achievements and performance

We started 2022 with renewed hope after the previous years of uncertainty surrounding the pandemic. We were back doing what we do best, making sure every Scout was having a Scouting experience that was full of adventure, skills, friendship and a powerful sense of belonging. The 2022 annual census of membership showed that Lonsdale District Scouts had a record-breaking growth of 17%.

The newest Scouting section, Squirrels, for 4 and 5 year-olds started the year with 2 Dreys and ended it with 6 Dreys, an amazing achievement and a section that has now become firmly rooted in the District to meet the needs of the age group hardest hit by the effects of Covid-19. We are committed to extending Squirrels to our priority communities in low-income areas and making sure that we provide for a more diverse range of people.

We are always very proud of our programme in Lonsdale and this year was no exception. We held lots of 'nights away' both in Groups and at District level. Our Scouts across all sections achieved top awards including the Duke of Edinburgh's Award, Explorer Belts, Young Leader belts, Scouts of the World awards and one of the last to be awarded, Queen's Scout Awards. These along with Chief Scout Awards in all sections are proof that as a District our programme is in a good place. We are strengthening our programme team and are improving the support that we give them.

We were back to holding large District events in April when we were again able to celebrate St George's Day where we held a very loud procession in Morecambe along the promenade.

#### Achievements and performance (continued).

Our two Activity Centres have seen a return in numbers camping both from Scouting members and Schools. The sites' volunteers work very hard throughout the year to keep them in tip top condition. The Activity Centres Management Board has developed a strategy for both sites that should help us maintain and develop the sites keeping them relevant and in touch with modern needs as well providing a place for traditional Scouting activities.

In the Summer of 2022, we once again attended the County International Camp, Red Rose 2022. With nearly half of our Groups represented and Lonsdale having the biggest contingent of Explorer Scouts on the camp. We enjoyed a very sunny week making new friends, meeting old friends and having lots of fun. The leaders that attended have said that they can't wait to do it all again in 2024!

All of the above would not be possible without our army of incredible volunteers. Together we have a single goal; to help more young people gain 'Skills for Life'. In Lonsdale we stay committed to supporting all our members and we value everything that they do. Finally, we have held two Adult awards ceremonies in 2022 at which we thanked them all for their hard work and commitment.

With more of these fabulous volunteers we can reach the 'North Star'

### Financial Review

Receipts in the year were £105,702 with payments of £125,129.

The main sources of receipts are the lettings at the campsites, membership subscriptions and Government grants.

The main items of payments are the upkeep of the two campsites, the provision of the District Headquarters, support to members within the District, including members' trips and activities.

The District held £68,635 restricted and designated funds at the year end which are earmarked for specific purposes. The policy is to hold cash reserves at a level to meet regular anticipated unrestricted expenditure for three months, which which would amount to around £20,000.

#### **Public Benefit**

The Trustees believe that we have met the Charity Commission's public benefit criteria for both the advancement of education and the advancement of citizenship and community development.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2022

#### **ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The financial statements have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis as the District Scout Council's total annual income does not exceed £250.000.

The Scout Council owns land and buildings at the Silverhelme and Littledale Campsites which are valued at £378,000 and £621,000 respectively, £999,000 in total. This represents the replacement value established in 2021 and it has been used to insure the buildings.

The value of fixtures and fittings (currently £54,395) will be reviewed in 2023.

#### **IMPROVEMENTS TO FACILITIES**

In 2022, at Littledale the Filtration System was completed, the Archery Range was rebuilt to meet current standards by a volunteer team mainly from Torrisholme, and Dic Golf introduced as a new activity.

#### **FUNDS**

The Endowment Funds, the income from which is available for distribution as grants to help Lonsdale District's Scout Groups, are known in the Scout District as the "Sharpe Bequest". This year the income amounted to £2,459. Grants totalling £193 were made.

In order to try to secure a greater income than is presently available on bank and building society deposits and achieve some capital growth over the longer term, the Executive Committee decided to move the whole of the fund over a period of a year in equal monthly instalments from May 2021 into equity based investments with Fidelity International Ltd.

The funds designated as "Restricted" are monies held in District Funds on behalf of other activities in the District. A Property Development Fund, categorised as a "Designated" Fund, was set up. Details are:-
