TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020.

Structure, governance and management.

The District is a constituent part of the Scout Association (incorporated by Royal Charter, which in turn gives authority to both the Bye Laws and Policy Organisation and Rules of the Scout Association).

In addition, the District is a charity registered separately with the Charity Commission.

The charity is managed by its Trustees (the District Executive Committee, with members appointed in accordance with the Governing Document - Policy, Organisation and Rules).

The Trustees are responsible for complying with charity legislation.

This includes registration, keeping proper accounts and making returns to the Charity Commission as appropriate.

The District Executive Committee exists to support the District Commissioner in meeting the responsibilities of her appointment.

Objectives and activities.

The objectives of the District are as a unit of the Scout Association.

The aim of the Scout Association is to promote the development of young people in achieving their full physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potentials, as individuals, as responsible citizens and as members of their local, national and international communities.

The method of achieving the Aim of the Association is by providing an enjoyable and attractive scheme of progressive training, based on the Scout Promise and Law and guided by adult leadership.

Achievements and performance.

From a deadly pandemic to a global movement for racial justice, the year 2020 certainly experienced its fair share of world-shifting events.

For us in Lonsdale 2020 started off on a high with a wonderful awards ceremony at Leighton Hall, celebrating the achievements of our adult volunteers within the District.

The annual Scout census at the end of January saw amazing growth across all sections, allowing us to bring Scouting to even more young people - the lull before the storm!

We held two successful open nights at 1st Carnforth Scout Group presaging the opening of three new sections.

A successful selection evening in February helped us choose the team that would lead the Lonsdale contingent to the Swedish International Jamboree in 2021; a wonderful opportunity for our young people to experience different cultures.

In March the Covid-19 pandemic and the need for social distancing sadly brought about a temporary end of 'face to face' Scouting. All Groups were required to close their meeting venues and Groups and sections were no longer allowed to meet. The resulting challenge was enormous, but was accepted, and within weeks many of the sections moved to meeting online. Scouting did not stop. We had to change the way we ran meetings and programmes had to be rewritten in a way that the Leaders had not done before.

Achievements and performance (continued).

New technology skills were very quickly acquired and we spent the next few months sat in front of a screen. An age of new Scouting was taking place - scavenger hunts, cooking, games, coding, map skills, badge work and lots of quizzes. Camping at home became a popular activity with tents being erected in gardens and dens in living rooms.

We have been unable to have any residential experiences on our Activity Centres since March but we have great plans for when we are allowed to reopen. The sites have been maintained in excellent condition by the Site Wardens and they are anticipating lots of 'Nights Away' taking place once this is possible.

Group and District Committee meetings quickly found their way into a virtual world. Indeed, some committees discovering that they were working more effectively online. Group AGMs were also held online on 'Zoom' as was a very successful District AGM. Leader training also had to move online and the opportunity was taken by many to update their mandatory learning.

This year saw Mrs Suzie Reynolds DL retire as District President, and we thank her for all her hard work as a fantastic supporter and promoter of Lonsdale Scouts. Mrs Kath Bromilow MBE has taken over the reins as President and we welcome her to Scouting and can't wait for her to experience our unique brand of adventure and fun.

Later in the year, with the relaxing of Covid-19 rules we were again allowed to meet, but in outside situations only. We appointed a Covid Risk Assessment Group to check and approve the Group Risk Assessments and many started to meet again, socially distanced of course.

With each lockdown and readiness level change the leaders and young people have shown resilience and true Scouting spirit. With very little indoor Scouting having taken place this year, we are very much looking forward to re-building Scouting within Lonsdale District. We know it won't be easy, but we know that, with the fantastic leaders and Executive members we have within the District, we will be able to achieve our goal.

Financial Review

Receipts in the year were £93,995 with payments of £64,968. The main sources of receipts are the lettings at the campsites, membership subscriptions and Government grants.

The main items of payments are the upkeep of the two campsites, the provision of the District Headquarters, support to members within the District, including members' trips and activities.

The District held £14,862 restricted and designated funds at the year end which are earmarked for specific purposes. The policy is to hold cash reserves at a level to meet regular anticipated unrestricted expenditure for three months, which which would amount to around £20,000.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis as the District Scout Council's total annual income does not exceed £250,000.

The Scout Council owns land and buildings at the Silverhelme and Littledale Campsites which are valued at £305,000 and £460,000 respectively, £765,000 in total. This represents the replacement value established in 2015 and it has been used to insure the buildings. This will be re-evaluated during 2021. The value of the fixtures and fittings, totalling £41,900, will also be reviewed during 2021.

IMPROVEMENTS TO FACILITIES

In 2020, the refurbishment of the Toilet Block at our Littledale Campsite was completed at a cost during the year of £8,835.

FUNDS

The Endowment Funds are known in the Scout District as the "Sharpe Bequest". This bequest consists of an indexed capital sum with only the remaining income available for distribution as grants to help Lonsdale District's Scout Groups. This year the income amounted to £1,413. Grants totalling £267 were made.

The funds designated as "Restricted" are monies held in District Funds on behalf of other activities in the District. A Hardship Fund, categorised as a "Designated" Fund, was set up to provide loans to Groups suffering financial difficulties. Details are:-
