

Explore Silverdale Walk - Answers

Turn left out of the campsite entrance along the road.

1. What are the public requested NOT to do? loiter crossing the course

Turn left on footpath towards Burton Well. Go down steps to Lambert's Meadow

2. Which organisation owns Lambert's Meadow? National Trust

Turn left after footbridge, before the gate.

3. What was the large aquatic feature on your left used for? a well

Continue uphill on track through woodland

4. How many chimneys are there on Burton Well Cottage? three

Turn left up Bottoms Lane, then right on The Green.

- 5. How old is Crinkle Cottage? 468 years
- 6. What are the 2 animals on number 2? otters

Bear left to road (watch the traffic!). Turn right and follow road a short distance to footpath on right towards The Church/Emesgate Lane.

After 600m, bear left on footpath into the churchyard.

7. Who lives in the hut on the right? Silverdale Scouts

Turn left along road and into Silverdale village

- 8. Did a blacksmith work here once? The Old Forge
- 9. Who/What lives in the 'tent' with the red doors? Lancs Fire Service

Note: There are toilets on the right.

10. What date was the village clock erected? 2000

Go PAST the pub and turn right at the corner

11. Who are welcome at the Silverdale Hotel? Children



Round the bend, take the footpath on the right towards The Cove & Arnside

- 12. What is the special quality about Marston's cask ales? Traditional
- 13. How many chimneys can you count on the row of cottages by the shore? 6.5

Follow the footpath across the Lots onto the shore.

14. Tide permitting – how long is the cave? 10m, 20m or 30m.

Turn right through the gate and up the road.

15. Whose padlock secures the gate – make & model . . . ABUS No 65/60

Turn right along road towards Silverdale (watch the traffic!).

Cross to the footpath, bear left on footpath towards Elmslack/Eaves Wood.

16. What is available behind the red gate of number 7? fresh water

Take footpath ahead (left a bit) towards Eaves Wood & Water Slack.

17. What is the 'kindest cut'? coppicing

Those with a thirst for adventure (and a liking for a good view & bonus points!) turn left uphill towards the Pepper Pot.

If anyone is weary, they can tarry awhile and await their return (about 15 mins).

18. What date was the monument erected? 1887

Adventurers - return by the same route to the main path.

Turn left towards the Car Park.

19. Opposite the door marked 'private' how many structures are there? 3 What function do you think they perform? water tanks?

Follow footpath through Eaves Wood.

20. What are the fences intended to contain? deer

Turn right towards the Car Park.

21. What is the 'return time for the walk to the Pepper Pot'? 1 Hour



Through the car park, cross the road to The Row (watch the traffic!).

22. Who does garden maintenance and is CRB checked? Andrew Alston

Take the footpath on the left through the small green gate by number 37 Bigland House. Bear right.

23. Which flower, the rarest in Britain, do you pass on your left. Obviously, please don't touch! Lady's-slipper Orchid

Continue on footpath to reach The Row again.

24. What was the name of the well? Dogslack

Turn left along the road and back to the campsite.

25. Who manufactured the mailbox? Brabantia
