Introduction

Lonsdale District Scouts & Explorers are going to the International campsite 'Zellhof'. Zellhof is an old church-owned estate that has been developed by the Salzburg Scouts and Guides into an International campsite for young people managed by an international team of



volunteers.

The site is situated on the edge of the Grabensee Lake, which is one of the warmest lakes for bathing in Salzburg Land, about 1.5km from the village of Mattsee and 20km north of the city of Salzburg.

The site and area offers an abundance of activities for varying levels of interest and technical expertise. The objective for the trip is for the participants to experience local

culture, take part in activities never before experienced and make new friends.

Who can go?

We are looking for Lonsdale Scouts and Explorer Scouts who will be old enough and invested as a Scout / Explorer Scout, prior to the start of the trip.

Itinerary

Many of the details need to be finalised as it is planned that we wish to include the young people in the planning and decision making for the trip including deciding which activities they wish to try, then it is our job as leaders to plan and provide what is possible.

We intend to fly from the UK to Munich and will be transferred directly to the site using a local coach transfer company as advised by the site. For the duration of the trip and for cost purposes we have provisionally booked indoor accommodation with cooking facilities. The advantage of using indoor accommodation is that our young people can be out all day, every day but always have somewhere warm and dry to retire to at night.



The site offers an abundance of activities such as volleyball, football, canoeing, table tennis, rowing, mountain biking, walking, swimming, space for wide games, and a local forest.

The local area has some fantastic organised trips available to the salt mines, ice caves, Eagles Nest, Grossglockner, white water rafting and Salzburg City. We also intend offering opportunities to camp and other international linking activities towards badges and awards.



On our way home, we plan to stay 2 nights in Munich where we have the opportunity to see Marien square with its beautiful chiming clock, BMW welt, Munich Zoo, German museum's and Dachau concentration camp

Please note we cannot offer everything but during the training weekends the young people will get to suggest, design and plan their own adventure.

How much will it cost?

The budgeted cost per person will be £995 for the entire trip, including flights, transport & scout travel insurance, accommodation, food & drink, all activities, 2 nights in Munich, 3 training weekends leading up to the trip and some branded clothing for the trip. We aim to book all flights and transport early to get the best prices and by the end of 2018 we will be in a position to finalise costs to you all.

The dates for the three planned training weekends prior to the trip are yet to be confirmed but we expect they will be confirmed in the coming few months. The weekends are as important as the trip as they are used to get to know one another, build team work, program plan, understand local culture and all while having fun, smiling and laughing.

The trip cost you may be aware is approximately £250 more expensive than the County trip to Zellhof in 2016 as we need to budget for two likely expensive nights' accommodation, activities & food in Munich. We intend to contact some local German Troops to ask accommodation advice and will work hard to reduce this extra cost. Of course, whatever money is left belongs to you and will be returned at the end of the trip or as soon as we know more detailed costs.
